Iowa Gamma Returns to Campus

igma Alpha Epsilon officially returned to Iowa State as an emerging chapter (formerly "colony", the term was changed at the 2021 convention) in fall 2020. SAE's professional expansion staff partnered with local alumni to recruit an initial core group of new members. On August 17, 2020, Iowa Gamma made SAE history by being the first chapter to host a virtual initiation, inducting seven men as members of the emerging chapter over Zoom.

Led by Eminent Archon Reindl Weaver '24, the chapter elected officers, created bylaws, began holding regular chapter meetings, and gave back to the Ames community by volunteering at a food bank. Peter Holleman '09 served as chapter advisor for the 2020-21 school year, joined by an active alumni advisory committee that helped the chapter understand what it means to be a thriving fraternity that lives out the words of the True Gentleman. Despite the challenges of not being able to attend class in person, since most Iowa State classes were held virtually, members were able to build bonds of brotherhood and conduct the

2021 saw the SAE national convention come to Des Moines. Several Iowa Gamma undergraduates were able to attend the convention and get their first taste of the national scope of our fraternity.

The following month, over 40 alumni returned for a work weekend at the chapter house, preparing it for SAEs to live at 140 Lynn for the first time since 2015.

Reindl Weaver '24 received a certificate of appreciation for his service as Iowa Gamma's first Eminent Archon as a resurrected chapter, Scott Kundel '02 received the Churchill Award in recognition of his work as treasurer of the House Corporation Board, keeping the Iowa Gamma House Corporation in good financial shape during the chapter's suspension, and Tomy Hillers '03 received the Order of the Lion for his tireless efforts to reconnect alumni to Iowa Gamma.

Steve Churchill '85 became only the 148th member of SAE to receive the fraternity's highest honor, the Distinguished Service Award. Presented at the 165th Anniversary Convention in Des Moines, the award recognizes Steve's longtime service to SAE at the chapter, local, and national levels. Steve served 10 years on the Supreme Council, including a term as Eminent Supreme Archon from 2015-17. He is only the third Iowa Gamma alumnus to serve in a national leadership role, following Chick Lee '27 (Eminent Supreme Archon) and Tom Goodale '62 (Eminent Supreme Recorder).

Cy Kirk '44 celebrated his 100th birthday on February 4, 2022, and was profiled by WHO-TV as part of their Veterans' Voices series. A bomber pilot during World War II, Cy shared stories about flying missions behind enemy lines over Germany. Before leaving for Europe, he got engaged to a fellow graduate of Des Moines Roosevelt High School, future Hollywood actress and Academy Award winner Cloris Leachman. She broke off the engagement before he returned from Europe, though. "I do remember I got my ring back and I sold it to one of my fraternity brothers so I never lost any money," Cy said.




